### Transcript

### Objectifs et démarche pédagogique

**Civilisation :** éducation.

**Structures :** V + *-ing, simple present, which (relative) short answers, have to* pour l'obligation.

**b)** Une trace écrite sous forme de reprise du champ lexical est ensuite demandée.

3. Activité de dictée, justifiée par un texte court, basée sur des chiffres et des mots simples ou déjà utilisés. Faire une écoute, puis fractionner en fonction des besoins.
